Context




- The Government's new target to reduce emissions to 62–70% below 2005 levels by 2035 means that the schemes the CER administers are more crucial than ever.
- A strong compliance and enforcement framework is fundamental to maintaining the integrity of Australia's greenhouse gas reduction schemes.
- Audits are an important compliance monitoring tool for the CER's schemes.
- Ongoing parliamentary scrutiny on both the CER's schemes, and on auditor quality and independence.

CER compliance priorities

2025–26

- The CER is actively taking enforcement action drawing from the full suite of compliance and enforcement powers.
- This includes infringement notices, and civil and criminal penalties.



Audit and Inspection activity


There have now been more than 5000 audits provided to the CER under the audit framework since 2010.

In 2024–25 the CER:

- Received and assessed 469 audits from scheme participants.
- Initiated 3 Compliance Audits.

The CER will conduct 8 auditor inspections in the upcoming 2025–26 program.
