




This user guide is intended to provide general information about what the process for registering a Renewable Electricity Guarantee of Origin (REGO) certificate under the *Future Made in Australia (Guarantee of Origin) Act 2024* (GO Act) may look like. The Future Made in Australia (Guarantee of Origin) Rules (the Rules) and other subordinate legislation are subject to change, and the process outlined in this user guide is subject to change as systems are updated.

Description of the certificate registration process

If you're a registered person under the GO Act and have registered a renewable electricity facility, you can create and apply to register REGO certificates in Online Services.

To do so, you will enter the calculated eligibility for your facility into an excel template provided in Online Services. This template will be tailored to the specific facility. You will also use the template to specify any eligible electricity allocated to other certification schemes and the number of REGO certificates to create and submit for the registration application.

Once filled in, you can upload one or more templates into Online Services to claim your certificates.


When we receive the claim, we will generate an invoice and send this to you. This invoice must be paid before we assess your certificates.

If we require further information or clarification we will send you a request for further information. If you do not respond to a request for further information within the time period specified in the request, we may cease considering your certificates and they won't be registered. Another application (including the fee payment) would need to be made to register the certificates.

Once your certificates have been approved, Online Services will reflect this outcome. On a successful registration, details of the certificates will be made publicly available on the GO Register and the certificates can then be transferred or retired.

How to create REGO certificates

1. Go to Online Services and sign in as a user in the eligible registered person account. To create REGO certificates, click on the **Renewable electricity facilities** button.





2. For the facilities you are creating certificates for, click **Download template**.

3. Select the claim period that you want to create and register REGO certificates for and click **Download**. This will download a certificate data template in the form of an excel spreadsheet.

4. Fill out the templates you downloaded in step 3. You will have to download and fill out a different template for each facility, but each template can be used to claim multiple months at a time, unless your facility has nominated to create yearly certificates. Once filled, you will upload this to Online Services in the next steps.

Make sure you save your template as an .xls or .xlsx file before you upload it.



5. In Online Services, on the **Renewable electricity facilities** page from step 2, click **Generation and certificate upload**. This will take you to the REGO generation and certificate upload form.

A template upload may take several minutes to complete while our system performs the necessary validation and calculations. You can leave and return later to check on the status of the file uploads if needed.



Online Services allows you to upload template files for multiple facilities in one upload, allowing you to make claims for multiple facilities in the same workflow.

You may only upload one file for each included facility. When uploading templates for multiple facilities, each facility's claim will be considered as a separate application for assessment purposes.

7. On the **Standing notice** page, answer the standing notice questions for each facility included in the claim.

This tab refers to generation that is in excess of the baseline for the facility. Once the facility crosses its baseline, certificates can be allocated, created and registered here. If the baseline has not yet been crossed, use the 'Below-Baseline Certificate' tab instead. It is possible that both tabs will need to be completed if the baseline is crossed within the selected period.

The **Above-Baseline Eligible Amount** column (D) will show 0 until the baseline is crossed, regardless of what the **Eligible Amount** (column C) is.

In this tab, you can allocate how much of the eligible amount you are using for REGO claims. You can only create REGOs if you have not used the same generation as the basis for creating certificates in other relevant schemes. This means that the total number of REGOs, large-scale generation certificates (LGCs) and other certificates you create can't exceed the **Eligible Amount**.

The allocation columns (J, K, and L above) allow you to split the **Above-Baseline Eligible Amount** (column D above) between REGOs and other schemes. An eligible amount that has not been allocated to any scheme will appear in the **Unallocated Eligible Amount** column (M).

The amount you can apply to create and register will appear in the **Timestamped REGOs Available to Create and Register** column (N). This number will be rounded down to the nearest whole MWh amount. Previously created REGO certificates or pending REGO registrations for the same time period are removed from this amount. Columns E-I show information about previous claims for the facility in the same time period.

Enter the **Number of Timestamped REGOs to Create and Register** in column O. You don't need to create and register all REGO certificates in this claim that are available to create and register.

The **Residual Fraction** column (R) will only appear for those facilities using hourly timestamping of REGO certificates. It is the remaining partial MWh amount left over from rounding. They can be summed and used to create and register REGO certificates in the **Residuals** tab.

You can enter formulas in green cells.

Below-baseline certificate

This tab will not appear if your facility does not have a baseline.

This tab refers to generation that is below the baseline of the facility. It works the same as the Certificate tab as described above. They have been separated due to the restrictions set out by the GO Rules on how below-baseline REGO certificates can be used.



The **Below-Baseline Eligible Amount** will show 0 once the baseline is crossed, regardless of what the eligible amount is.

Residuals and below-baseline residuals

This tab will only appear if you are applying to create and register REGO certificates on an hourly basis. Daily, monthly, and yearly certificates don't qualify for residual amounts.

As a REGO certificate can only be created for a whole MWh of eligible generation, this leaves 'residual fractions' unclaimed for each hour. For example, if a facility created 4.7MWh in the hour between 2 pm and 3 pm on 1 September 2025, only 4 REGO certificates could be created with that timestamp and the residual fraction for that hour would be 0.7MWh. The GO Act allows these residual fractions to be summed within a month to form a 'residual amount'. Residual certificates will be timestamped with only the month and year in which the generation occurred.

The **Residual REGOs Available to Create and Register** column (J) will autofill with the maximum number that can be created and registered. This is based on information in the **Certificate** tab, as well as previously registered (or pending registration) residual amounts for the same time period.

Enter how many residual REGO certificates you wish to create and register in column K.

The **Residuals** tab refers to generation that occurred after the facility crossed its baseline.

The **Below-Baseline Residuals** tab refers to generation that occurred before the facility crossed its baseline. Both tabs work in the same way yet need to be separated due to the restrictions on below-baseline REGO certificate use set out by the GO Rules.
